Climate change We need to promote more housing choices in West Vancouver with careful density projects that are sensitive to neighbourhood character. For transportation, we must work with the province and local governments to deliver alternate transportation choices to reduce

		demand on our current infrastructure. Both these challenges will provide opportunities to reduce West Vancouver's climate impact.
7.	Do you support a 38M publicly funded Arts Centre? In Ambleside Park? With a hotel? If not, what sort of arts facilities would you support? (75 words or less)	I support arts and culture in West Vancouver as it's an integral part of our history and something we must carefully plan to support for the future. The scope and scale must be appropriate and economically sustainable in the short and long terms. I support a facility with a mix of learning, studio, and display spaces which is identified as a community need by the District's Economic Development Plan (2018) and the ADBIA's Imagine Ambleside.
8.	What is the maximum height and density you would support for future buildings along Marine Drive corridor and Ambleside and Dundarave Villages?	I support a height and density that combines the feedback from the community, future local area plans, ADBIA's Imagine Ambleside, and other community reports. Developments along our vital corridors must be seen as opportunities to mix commercial and residential. This is a smart way to increase our housing options, which in turn will support the businesses.
9.	Traffic gridlock has been a major issue identified by residents. What actions would you take to address this issue? (50 words or less)	I view mobility in two ways: 'moving within West Vancouver' and 'moving out of West Vancouver'. Regarding the former, we need more safe, accessible transportation choices which connect residents to key community hubs. Regarding the latter, we need to work with the province and other local governments.
